Flight of the Dragonfly Mini Quilt Pattern

Supplies Needed

White tone on tone Fabric 5% yard (includes border fabric)

Red Fabric 3% yard

Backing Fabric 25" x 25"

Wadding/Batting 25" x 25"

Binding 3 strips 2½" x WOF

Things you should know

Throughout this pattern, we use a scant ¼ seam allowance

How to set a Scant Quarter Inch Seam

WOF = Width of Fabric.

Cross Cut = to cut across the fabric.

Reduced stitch length = to shorten your machine stitch length.

The weight of thread = how thick or thin your thread is.

HST = Half Square Triangle.

RST = Right sides of the fabric together.

Flight of the Dragonfly is based on a basic Half Square Triangle block. We show you two methods on how to do them.

Below is cutting instructions for both Traditional cutting method And the speed method.

Cutting Instructions For >

Traditional Method.

From Red Fabric
Cut 25 ≈ 3%" x 3%" squares.

From the Background (white tone on tone).

Cut $25 \approx 3\%$ " x 3%" squares. Cut $2 \approx 2$ " x $25\frac{1}{2}$ " Strips (side Borders).

Cut $2 \approx 2$ " x $22\frac{1}{2}$ " Strips (top & Bottom Borders).

Backing Fabric **≈25**" x 25" Square.

Wadding/Batting \approx 25" x 25" Square.

Cut $4 \approx 2\frac{1}{2}$ " Strips WOF for Binding.

Cutting Instructions For >

Strip Piecing Method.

<u>From Red Fabric</u>
Cut 3 ≈ 3% Strips.

From the Background (white tone on tone).

Cut $3 \approx 3\%$ strips WOF Cut $2 \approx 2$ x $25\frac{1}{2}$ Strips (side Borders).

Cut $2 \approx 2$ " x $22\frac{1}{2}$ " Strips (top & Bottom Borders).

Backing Fabric **≈25**" x 25" Square.

Wadding/Batting \approx 25" x 25" Square.

Cut $4 \approx 2\frac{1}{2}$ " Strips WOF for Binding.

Step 1. Pick one or the other method Traditional Method of Piecing.

- 1. After cutting your 25 red squares and 25 White squares measuring 3%" you will need to take one white and one red and place them right sides together.
 - 2. Make sure that the white square is on top of the red square. Now, take your ruler and your Frixion pen and as shown in the video, mark diagonally from one corner to the other. Repeat for all 25 units.
 - 3. Next, you are going to head to the sewing machine and you are going to sew a ¼" seam allowance on either side of the line you just marked. Refer to the video for guidance. Chain piece all 25 units.
 - 4. Next, we are going to turn our sewn squares into HST's. The line that you marked earlier is now going to be your cut line. Cut diagonally from corner to corner and repeat with the remaining units...you should have 50 in total.

OR

Strip Piecing Method.

- Take your 3% strips the WOF. And place the Red and White strips with RST and align all your raw edges. Pin into place.
- 2. Next, take your ruler and place the short end of the strip on the 3% mark on your ruler and mark with your Frixion pen a vertical line, then repeat by placing your 3% mark on your ruler on that line and continue up along the entire length of the strip.
- 3. Now we are going to mark diagonally from the left-hand bottom corner of your strip up to the first solid line you marked, you will then continue this all the way along your strip piece set. It should look like a zig zag pattern...For Guidance Refer to the tips and trick video.
- 6. Now you are going to head over to the sewing machine. Using a 1/4" seam allowance you are going to sew on either side of the diagonal lines working your way down the strip...once you get to the end turn and come all the way back along the strip set.
- 7. Next, you are going to cut your strip set into squares and you do this by Cutting on the vertical solid lines that you marked earlier. You will have 25 square sets in total.
- 8. Now, you are going to cut the solid diagonal line on each of your square units...You should now have 50 HST.

Step 2. Layout


Take your layout image below and on a large table start to layout your HST's as shown on the image...You have 7 rows by 7 HST's per row.

Once you have all your HST's in the correct position then stack each row starting on the left-hand side of the quilt and once they are all stacked on each other number that row as #1 and continue doing this for each row...

Once you have all your HST's stacked head to the sewing machine and sew each row together and lay back out on your design board of layout table...

Next, you are going to press all your seams open. Now, take row one add row two and place RST. Aligning all the seams and pin into place.

Now, using a ¼" seam allowance sew along the long edge you just pinned remembering to backstitch at the beginning and the end. Repeat by adding each row until you have done all 7 rows.



Step 3. Borders

Next, we are going to take our borders strips and add our 2" x 22½". And add to the top and bottom of our mini Quilt...Then, take your remaining border strips and add to both the right-hand and left-hand side of your quilt... Tada your Flight of the Dragonfly Mini Quilt Top is now complete.



Step 4. Quilting

Next, we move onto quilting...

Let your imagination run wild and quilt your mini as desired...but for those that have not done quilting before you can see how I marked it. And how I have quilted it...I used a 50wt cotton thread. White in colour and quilted only the white fabrics...You can see this more clearly in the supplementary video.



Step 5. Binding

Cut your binding strips at 2 ½" WOF then View the video that we have provided for you To complete your binding.
